



### Maker Meetup - Let's Make & Create

Did you know that Central Rivers AEA media provides support and learning for Makerspaces? Whether you are just getting started with your Makerspace or have one fully developed, each summer Central Rivers hosts a Maker Meetup: Let's Make & Create, a one day workshop where fellow 'makers' are inspired by participating in maker experiences and learning practical advice about the use of Makerspaces.



This year's keynote was Lyndsey Own. Lyndsey was a classroom educator and curriculum director for 15 years. Recently, she transitioned to coordinating makerspace learning across all preschool through 8th-grade classes at her school in Seattle, WA. Her keynote highlighted the connection between Social Emotional Learning and Makerspaces. In the afternoon, she spent time 'making' with fellow educators. Her session

titled, Serious Engineering with Simple Materials, gave attendees the opportunity to use everyday items to build and create.

Other presenters that day included Aaron Maurer, STEM Lead for Mississippi Bend. Aaron hosted a session on 'Do It Yourself Maker Hacks'. Jenahlee Chamberlain, Iowa City Teacher Librarian, tied connection between literacy and Makerspace during her session titled: 'Makerspaces are Lit'. 



lowa's Area Education Agencies are changing the way students and educators find high-quality digital information. Enter AEA Scout: One login. One search. One interface.

AEA Scout is a new online portal that provides access to many of the digital resources provided by Iowa's AEAs: AEA Digital Library, American History in Video, Encyclopedia Britannica, Gale, Learn 360, Mackin VIA, PBS Learning Media, SIRS Researcher and Teen Health & Wellness. Students benefit from a one-stop-shop for their research needs, and teachers can rest easy knowing their students are searching the quality, curated content they've come to know and trust.

AEA Scout is still currently under development so you will continue to see enhancements. Coming soon in the near future will include an updated interface, apps for devices, seamless student login, additional features as well as enhanced content integration. We would welcome the opportunity for you to begin exploring AEA Scout yourself or with a group of students.

### **Accessing AEA Scout**


- Available Now: Educators can log in using their "AEA Login" -- the same username and password they use to login to training via the AEA Learning Online system for professional learning.
- Student access is not yet fully developed. While the AEAs are working on a more seamless way for students to access AEA Scout, they can use their school-issued email address and a special building code provided by their AEA librarian or media director/consultant to log in. Please contact either Cari Teske or Cheryl Roberson for building code information to be used to set up individual students accounts. Individual access is still available for all current digital resources including those that aren't currently integrated into AEA Scout. Visit Central Rivers' 'new' resource website or lowa's AEAs website for these great resources. The individual logins that you have used in the past will still work to get into the resources individually.

# Media Services Materials GiveAway for 2019

Central Rivers AEA Media Services strives to maintain a current collection of resources for our schools to access. In order to maintain the currency and relevance of our materials, each summer our media collection is reviewed or "weeded" to remove dated materials or materials that have not been circulating out to schools on a regular basis.

Each year, these weeded materials are offered to school districts who may have need for these extra resources. In the past, materials have been given away in our regional offices. This year, in order to provide more equity to our give-away process, Media Services has created a giveaway web site so that all teachers may request these materials that won't be circulated by the AEA anymore.

Each year, different sections of the AEA Media Collection are reviewed. This year our focus was on Professional Books (PB), Media Kits (KT) and Book Resource (BR) materials. Next year, different formats of materials will be reviewed for weeding, including student Boxed Books (BB) and Books with Audio (BA) formats with student books.

This special website will open up for teacher requests on **September 9, 2019**. You will order these giveaway materials using a process very similar to ordering regular media materials via our GetMedia Catalog.

## New Titles Added to MackinVIA with Exceptional Audio Quality

Central Rivers AEA Media Services is excited to share that over 100 new 'Read-Along' titles have been added to MackinVIA eBook collection since last spring. Mackin 'Read-Alongs' is a special kind of eBook, featuring embedded human-voice narration synchronized with the words shown on the screen, which highlights as they are read.




#### Where Do I Find Read-Along Titles?

Read-along titles are designated by the book icon with the play button next to it within Mackin.

You may also locate Read-Along titles in the 'Advanced Search Section' while in 'All Resources' or the 'eBooks tab'. Scroll down through 'Advanced Search' and select 'More'. When you select 'More' you will get a menu of all of the different features

available and kinds of eBooks in the collection. Look for 'Read-Alongs'. From there you can select your 'Read-Alongs'.





#### What Makes These Titles So Special?

'Read-Along' titles are enhanced with embedded audio, synchronized to offer automatic page-turn functionality. All narrations are professionally performed by talented voice actors, with each word highlighted as the audio is read. Any young person, regardless of their reading proficiency, can open one of these books, follow along and comprehend. They can do it from their phone, computer or tablet. Anytime. Anywhere.

### Iowa School Library Program Standards Guidance

Assistance to local school districts in developing school library programs was last published by the lowa Dept. of Education in 2007. With new national standards developed in 2017 and renewed emphasis on literacy instruction in the state, a group of talented professionals integrated the national standards with lowa Code, lowa Administrative Rules and best practice to produce an updated document of school library program standards approved by the lowa Dept. of Education in 2019.

### Library Programs in Iowa Code

Iowa Code describes the minimum requirements for library programs in the state. The new Library Program Standards Document includes voluntary program standards which help districts move beyond compliance to committing to a successful quality library program.



### **lowa's Library Program Standards**

This document may be used by teacher librarians and leadership teams to discuss how Library Programs can support continuous improvement, especially universal instruction and local infrastructure. It was developed in the same format as the SAMI SelfAssessment of MTSS Implementation.

The standards are designed to be used as a needs assessment tool for leadership teams to understand the status of the school library program, as well as identify areas where the teacher librarian and library program will support current continuous improvement areas of focus.
